I Dare You Award Applications Due

Each year Floyd County will award two with the I DARE YOU LEADERSHIP AWARD (2) senior 4-H'ers (age 14-18 by September 1 of the current year) with the I Dare You Award.

• All senior 4-H'ers are eligible to apply. Interested 4-H'ers must complete the county I Dare You Award application and submit it to the County Extension Office before the deadline

• No 4-H Record Book is required to apply.

• The Floyd County 4-H Parent/Leaders will select the winners each year, after reviewing all applications, by a secret ballot voting process.

• A 4-H'er may only receive the I Dare You Award one time in his or her 4-H career.

Applications for the I Dare You Award are available on-line at floyd-co.tamu.edu or you may call or come by the Extension Office for a copy of the application. Deadline for applications is **Wednesday**, **July 5th**, **NOON**.

D-2 4-H Day Camps

District 2 TAE4-HA is hosting a 4-H20 Camp at Caprock Canyons State Park in Quitaque **on June 14th**. Activities for the day will include: Fishing, Canoeing, Kayaking, Archery, Leather Craft, and Campfire Cooking. RSVP deadline is June 12th. District 2 will also host a 4-H Leadership Success Workshop in Plainview on **July 6th**. Along with a District 2 4-H Council Meeting, 4-H'ers will participate in leadership activities and the day will end with a dance. RSVP deadline is July 3rd. There is limited space available for both day camps so it is important to let the CEO know if you plan to attend. The cost is \$20 which includes both the 4-H20 camp and the Leadership Workshop. Please note, in order to bring your horse to practice you MUST have a current negative coggins test. You will not be allowed to practice if you are not enrolled in 4-H (for insurance and safety reasons) or if your horse is not current on health requirements. District Trap and Skeet

Registration for District Trap & Skeet opens June 1 and closes June 19. No late registrations will be accepted. The Trap competition will be held June 23 at the Palmer Gun Club in Garza County. Skeet, Whiz Bang and Sporting Clays will be held June 24 at the Gaines County Shooting Range. Shooters will register on 4H Connect first. There is a \$6.00 entry fee on 4H Connect. This fee is covered by the county and will be paid by a county check. After you are registered on 4H Connect, access iclays.com to register for the different events. The registration fee for Trap, Skeet, Whiz Bang and Sporting Clays is \$25 per event. Round fees are \$5 for Trap and \$5 for Skeet. Round fee for Whiz Bang is \$20 for a round of 50 targets. Sporting Clay fees are \$20 a round of 50 for Junior and Intermediates. Seniors will shoot 100 Sporting Clays for \$40. Example: Junior Skeet would be \$35, Junior Trap \$35, Junior Whiz Bang \$45 and Junior Sporting Clays \$45. If you want assistance calculating event fees contact Donna at the CEO. Event entered and the corresponding fees MUST be turned in to Donna at the CEO by NOON June 19.


