I Dare You Award Applications Due

Each year Floyd County will award two with the I DARE YOU LEADERSHIP AWARD (2) senior 4-H'ers (age 14-18 by September 1 of the current year) with the I Dare You Award.

- All senior 4-H'ers are eligible to apply. Interested 4-H'ers must complete the county I Dare You Award application and submit it to the County Extension Office before the deadline
- No 4-H Record Book is required to apply.
- The Floyd County 4-H Parent/Leaders will select the winners each year, after reviewing all applications, by a secret ballot voting process.
- A 4-H'er may only receive the I Dare You Award one time in his or her 4-H career.

Applications for the I Dare You Award are available on-line at floyd-co.tamu.edu or you may call or come by the Extension Office for a copy of the application. Deadline for applications is **Wednesday**, **July 5th**, **NOON**.

D-2 4-H Day Camps

District 2 TAE4-HA is hosting a 4-H20 Camp at Caprock Canyons State Park in Quitaque **on June 14th**. Activities for the day will include: Fishing, Canoeing, Kayaking, Archery, Leather Craft, and Campfire Cooking. RSVP deadline is June 12th. District 2 will also host a 4-H Leadership Success Workshop in Plainview on **July 6th**. Along with a District 2 4-H Council Meeting, 4-H'ers will participate in leadership activities and the day will end with a dance. RSVP deadline is July 3rd. Floyd County's Rifle Team is District Champ! On Saturday, April 8th the Floyd County Senior Rifle Team competed at the District 2 4-H Rifle Contest at South Plains College. The senior team consisted of Arnie Martinez, Rachel Graham and Mason Esty. The team has been practicing for this contest for months and was thrilled to receive 1st place. In addition to the team's first place win, Arnie Martinez received 1st place High Individual, 1st place kneeling position, 1st place standing position, and 2nd place prone position. Mason Esty received 3rd place High Individual, 2nd place standing, 3rd place kneeling, and 3rd place prone. Their rifle coaches, Winfield Davenport and Jerry Chappell, were there to support them as well. It takes a lot of practice and a very steady hand to shoot as well as they did. Congratulations on a job well done and good luck at the state competition in Victoria, Texas in June.

Horse Project

Our next countywide horse practice will be Sunday, May 28th at 3pm at the rodeo arena in Floydada. We will have one county practice per month that will be open to anyone currently enrolled in 4-H. Please note, in order to bring your horse to practice you MUST have a current negative coggins test. You will not be allowed to practice if you are not enrolled in 4-H (for insurance and safety reasons) or if your horse is not current on health requirements. Please bring all necessary documents to the first practice. The Big 5 Horse Show Association is open for enrollment on their web site: www.big5horseshow.com. If you plan on competing please make sure you get registered as a member ASAP. The fee increases from \$20 to \$40 after March 10th. Here is a schedule of shows for the year:

Basic Horse Handling Tips

Here are a few tips and reminders that are important to follow when handling a horse. Following these tips will ensure your safety as well as the horse's. 1) Never walk under the rope when a horse is tied up, always go around their back end. 2) When walking around the back end of a horse make sure they know you are there by placing your hand on top of their rear and talking to them. 3) When leading a horse always try to lead from the left side and don't loop your lead rope, instead keep it in a figure 8 pattern so if the horse runs off it will not close around your hand. 4) When leading a horse try and lead standing next to them rather than in front of them, this keeps you out of the way if your horse is spooked or wants to run. 5) Mount and dismount your horse from the left side. 6) Use a quick release knot when tying a horse up, that way if they pull back you can untie them quickly. 7) Always check your cinch again right before you mount your horse. Sometimes horses will hold air in their stomach when you are saddling them and later your saddle will be loose if you don't tighten it up.

Recordbook Information

Recordbooks are due to the County Extension office by **June 26th** for county judging. They will be due back to the CEO on **July 7th** if they are chosen to move onto District Recordbook judging on **July 12th**. If you have questions about recordbooks or were not able to attend the Recordbook training in April, please contact the CEO for more information.


